**1954 Shepherd Utility 22'.** Owner says: "ID#50 Shepherd utility for restoration. The frame and hull are solid with no know broken ribs or frames, although a few planks on the hull are starting to soften in the aft where they meet the transom. The topsides and deck look terrible with the varnish peeling and wrinkling....but are solid. Definately requires a full sanding and refinish from bare wood. Unfortunately from when I bought the boat, the deck hardware and windshield were removed and not included with the boat. There are companies that provide complete hardware kits for Shepherds, so this is not an end of the world issue. The interior is relatively complete, with some repairs necessary....but would be best used as a pattern for new. The original engine and gauges were also removed and replaced with a 305 Mercruiser from the late 80s and a hydraulic reverse transmission. She is sound and has received some very extensive hull retrofits.
